The creation of sections within the Department of Medicine is based on the clinical mandate of the Department to serve as the administrative organization of medical specialists for the Calgary Zone, Alberta Health Services (AHS). Department of Medicine also serves as the administrative organization for the University of Calgary's Cumming School of Medicine (CSM); in that academic context, Endocrinology & Metabolism is a Division of the Department of Medicine.

Members are associated with the AHS Section of Endocrinology & Metabolism by virtue of their Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and their College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta, Endocrinology & Metabolism certification.

A majority of Endocrinology & Metabolism Section members have a formal academic relationship with the CSM through either a full time academic appointment (assistant / associate / professor) or a clinical academic appointment (clinical assistant / clinical associate / clinical professor). Some members may have an Emeritus appointment. Many division members will be affiliated with the University of Calgary Medical Group (UCMG), a medical practice group for university-based physicians.

Alberta Health Services Calgary Zone operates five teaching hospitals in the city of Calgary, including the new South Health Campus acute care facility. AHS serves 1.8 million residents of Southern Alberta, Southeastern British Columbia and Southwestern Saskatchewan. Calgary is a vibrant city (population 1,267,344 in 2017) situated near the Rocky Mountains, Banff National Park and Lake Louise.

Increasing scholarly capacity will help the University of Calgary meet its strategic goal to become one of Canada's top five research universities, where innovative teaching and groundbreaking research go hand in hand, and where we fully engage the communities we both serve and lead. The strategy is called Eyes High, inspired by the university's Gaelic motto, which translates as 'I will lift up my eyes.'
