COVID-19 testing of Albertans continues to average more than 8,000 completed tests per day, and is expected to increase further in the coming weeks. The ongoing efforts of all healthcare staff doing this critically important work are very much appreciated.

It is imperative that we continue to ensure public understand the testing process and related timelines.

To ensure public expectations on test result timelines are appropriately informed, please be sure that all front-line healthcare staff conducting swabbing advise individuals being tested that:

 Positive test results are typically relayed to patients within 24 to 48 hours from the time of swabbing until the result is available; and negative test results can take five to seven days to be relayed to patients.

This same messaging is being communicated through AHS' COVID-19 webpage, including the online booking tool, as well as through AHS social media.

With your continued support, we can ensure Albertans are well-educated on turnaround times and reduce unnecessary concern about test result information.

UPDATED IPC PPE Table for Emergency Departments and Urgent Care Centres during COVID-19 (6 August 2020)

There is currently a directive from AHS for all staff in the ED to wear eye protection with patient contact, in addition to continuous masking. This is regardless of the COVID screening status of the patient. The rules are outlined in the IPC PPE Table.

Our IPC colleagues have stated that "Currently the intent of the continuous eye protection is to provide additional protection in areas where we may not know what the underlying illnesses are of the patients. In ED/UCC, the presenting complaint may not always elucidate a full picture of the patient status. As such, the instruction to wear continuous eye protection in addition to the continuous mask reduces the risk of being exposed should a patient be later identified as having COVID-19".

This means that consultants or trainees going to ED to see a patient must also abide by this rule. Eye protection is available in ED. When working in other areas of the hospital, eye protection is only required if indicated by the isolation status of the patient.

Alberta Precision Laboratories (APL)

NEW Travel Related COVID-19 Testing and Documentation Requests (28 August 2020)

Key Message:

Many countries and airlines are requiring documented COVID-19 nucleic acid/PCR tests for international travel. The time requirements vary among airlines and countries. Alberta Precision Laboratories (APL) is receiving requests for proof of a negative test taken 1-5 days in advance of time of travel. At this time, Canadian airlines are not requesting proof of negative tests for travel within Canada.

Why this is important:

APL has developed an intake process to respond to travel related testing requests, to help manage expectations and meet patient needs.

There is no priority or separate queue for travelers requiring travel related tests or documents. Testing priorities are outlined on the Alberta Health Website (https://www.alberta.ca/covid-19-testing-in-alberta.aspx). AHS and APL cannot guarantee that swabbing, testing and provision of results will be provided within the specified timeframe to meet the travel requirements. Albertans planning travel should allow at least seven days from the time they are swabbed for COVID-19 to having access to printable test results.

Information will be posted on the AHS/APL Websites and on social media to help travellers familiarize themselves with COVID-19 testing requirements and how to get their printed laboratory reports. Information can be found here. Patients asking about travel related COVID-19 testing should be directed to this information.

Survey on COVID-19 Research from AHS/AH

Health researchers must learn and innovate to address the COVID-19 pandemic and its sequelae through research and quality improvement efforts. Alberta is well-positioned to take a coordinated, provincial approach to address this need by understanding what patients, clinicians, researchers and health care administrators see as research priorities during this pandemic.

AHS has already been notified of 150+ current studies that seek to enrol people affected by COVID-19, especially patients who have experienced infection. We want to help Alberta researchers to create the best information possible. However, we also need to balance this against the need to protect our potential research participants from an undue burden of requests...especially overlapping requests from multiple groups.

If you are doing, or plan to do, research, clinical and/or quality improvement work related to COVID19, we ask you to take part in this 5-minute needs assessment survey. The questions ask about what type of research/quality improvement work you plan to do, whether you seek to contact individuals directly, and your thoughts on provincial coordination in this area.
