The Department of Medicine, University of Calgary and Alberta Health Services, Calgary, in conjunction with the Department of Community Health Sciences, University of Calgary, invites applications from outstanding investigators for a Contingent Term position as an academic gastroenterologist/ health services researcher, at the Associate Professor level in the Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology in the Cumming School of Medicine.

Qualifications include an MD, FRCPC certification in Gastroenterology and eligibility for specialist licensure in the Province of Alberta. This position is for a clinician-investigator with 75% protected time for research and administration with responsibilities aligning with clinical needs within the Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology. There is a special interest in both the Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology and the O'Brien Institute for Public Health for the recruitment of an academic clinician researcher with a specific expertise and training in clinical nutrition intervention research in digestive diseases, in particular IBD and cirrhosis as well as a specific interest in mind body interventions and impact on digestive health and wellness.

The recruit should have a demonstrated record of accomplishment in the dietary determinants of gut related inflammation, dietary interactions with the microbiome, methods of malnutrition screening and nutrition assessment, and experience with dietary intervention studies in digestive diseases. Specialized advanced training in clinical nutrition and medical education skills with a focus in knowledge translation using ehealth delivery are required. The applicant would be expected possess medical education advanced skills allowing them to successfully lead the RCPSC accredited Clinical Investigator Program within the Cumming School of Medicine.

An individual with this academic profile will align strongly with the strategic research priorities of the O'Brien Institute for Public Health within the Cumming School of Medicine, and the Institute's *Better Health Care* theme area, and more broadly with the University of Calgary's university-wide strategic research plan. Further, the proposed position will also strongly align with two of the university's Eyes High priority themes – specifically the priority stream that focuses on chronic disease, and the human dynamics priority stream (that focuses on social determinants of health and well-being).

Alberta Health Services operates five teaching hospitals in the city of Calgary, including the new South Health Campus acute care facility. AHS serves 1.8 million residents of Southern Alberta, Southeastern British Columbia and Southwestern Saskatchewan.
