

**Academic Position in Infectious Diseases
Department of Medicine
Cumming School of Medicine**

The Department of Medicine (<http://www.departmentofmedicine.com>), in partnership with the Snyder Institute for Chronic Diseases (<http://www.snyder.ucalgary.ca>) in the Cumming School of Medicine, University of Calgary and Alberta Health Services (<http://www.albertahealthservices.ca>) invites applications for a Contingent Term full-time academic position at the rank of Assistant Professor.

Qualifications required include a MD, certification in Internal Medicine, eligibility for regular or special licensure in the Province of Alberta, sub-specialty certification in Infectious Diseases and well documented interest in the area of cystic fibrosis. The candidate will have completed a Masters level training in either Public Health or Epidemiology and a minimum of one year dedicated training in cystic fibrosis care and research. The candidate is expected to adhere to the Alberta Health Services Bylaws and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada Code of Conduct.

The successful candidate will be involved in research activities and would participate in teaching at the University of Calgary in undergraduate and postgraduate clinical and academic programs. The position will have 65% protected time for research. The candidate must show evidence of a proven record of excellence in research as demonstrated by scholarly publications and the ability to compete successfully for funding. At the Assistant Professor level, this will entail the publication of at least 15 peer reviewed papers, with the majority as 1st or senior author.

Duties will include providing clinical care at the inpatient and outpatient Infectious Diseases Service and the Adult Cystic Fibrosis Outpatient Clinic. The cystic fibrosis team admits any adult cystic fibrosis patient who requires care in an acute care setting.

Remuneration will be via the alternative funding program and the University of Calgary. The value of remuneration will be based on a formal pay level grid used in the alternative funding program in Alberta. This funding is competitively valued. The position is a 1.0 FTE (230 days).
