Position: Program Director: Adult Infectious Disease Residency Training Program

The Division of Infectious Diseases of the University of Calgary Cumming School of Medicine invites applications for the role of Program Director for the Adult Infectious Diseases Residency Training Program. Applicants must have a continuing appointment within AHS/University of Calgary and be a member in good standing of the Division of Infectious Diseases.

The successful candidate must have a demonstrated interest in post-graduate medical education (M. Ed. or demonstrated ability), and the leadership/change-management skills required to take the program through the imminent transition to a competency-based educational paradigm. Furthermore, the successful candidate must be competent to participate and complete regular program reviews and accreditation activities.

The applicant must have strong organization skills, be capable of leading the resident selection process and chairing the ID Residency Training Committee. At all times it will be the successful candidate's responsibility to advocate on behalf of the trainees and training program.

The position requires strong skills in curriculum design, faculty development, educational assessment, and collaboration with other training program partners (Pediatric Infectious Diseases, Medical Microbiology, Public Health, Antimicrobial Stewardship, Hepatology and TB Services). The position will be remunerated at a rate that is commensurate with standards of other similar sized advanced residency training programs.

Applicants must submit all of the following by March 9th, 2020;

- A University formatted CV
- A one-page letter of intent highlighting those attributes that would qualify them for the position
- A minimum of three individuals to serve as references capable of speaking to the applicant's expertise in medical education (formal letters are NOT required)

All applications will be reviewed by a formal panel who will decide about the appropriateness of candidates and requirements/timing for interviews.
